The new management arrangement for the Bistro commenced on 23 March 2025. Under the arrangement the new Manager, David Elmes, is responsible for all the costs of operating the Bistro and receives a percentage of the gross revenue. The Club remains responsible for the overheads.

The Bistro increased to 7 days a week operation in November 2025.

With the additional use, maintenance and replacement costs of Bistro equipment was more than initially budgeted. However, some of the equipment replacement had already exceeded its expected life.
